Discomfort & Joy

Friends at MVPC,

I'm honored to be part of the Grapevine this season, as one of your Commissioned Pastors. You all have welcomed so many of us at Underground Ministries over the years--not only by hosting our prison-reentry programs and returning community members into the church campus and offices here, but by holding me personally and our organization through some hard seasons of heartbreak and transition.

So it's only right that I get to return the favor, during a hard season for the beloved congregation.

You've probably heard by now that Pastor Dan had a scary health emergency this past Wednesday night. I was with him when it happened, and with Rebecca at the hospital, along with some of you. I thank God that my friend Dan is alive and well right now. As the Holland family takes some time to heal together, I'll be stepping in and walking with you for several Sunday mornings ahead--just as we enter the Advent season.

In Advent, we re-trace the startlingly uncomfortable story of how God snuck into our world.

An unplanned teen pregnancy. A government-forced migration. A homeless young couple. The nightmare of giving birth in a cold barn. Only night-shift workers--strangers--showing up to greet the no-status baby, because they saw a wild vision while at work? Then leaders from a foreign country (and foreign religion) show up with gifts?

This is how God arrives?

It's not the story we wanted. That odd ensemble of characters standing around the squirming baby, recognizing God's promise in an embarassing, ugly and tender situation--I think that's a portrait of God's style. Every December, Jesus' jarring birth narratives call us out of our preferences: we obviously enjoy gathering with our favorite people, attending well-lit and manicured worship services, crackling fires and songs of comfort and joy.

The old nativity scene is, by contrast, more a portrait of discomfort and joy.

The better we get at entering difficult stories we want to avoid, the more I believe we get in on the joy. God is born in these situations. What if Mary or Josephy said, "But this isn't how it was SUPPOSED to happen! Everything is all wrong"? God chose a humble person who said, Let it be so. Or, Alright, let's do this.

Let's follow Mary's lead, and be people who say to the challenging calls ahead, "Let's do this." There's new relationships, unexpected community and mystery ahead. Joy.

I'll be with you for several Sundays ahead, including some more tamale-making with Underground families and OUR Journey youth in our valley on December 8th.

Let's bring our gifts this season, like the wise folks, to out-of-the way places. Let's rub shoulders with strangers and night shift workers. Let's draw near to the low points in our lives, hidden places our community, not be afraid of the story we wanted radically changing. Let's not miss how and where God brings joy to the world.

Opportunities to Connect & Grow

Your church cares about you and wants to be supportive and helpful to you in whatever you are going through! Please reach out to the church office or to any of the church staff or leadership if you or someone you know is in need of care. The Deacon Board has approved and begun to use a new congregational care coordination tool to help better coordinate care at MVPC. The Deacon Board has also been busy building up the Commissioned Deacon Care Team in various roles of care in our church with quarterly gatherings for those providing care to receive training and support. Please talk with Pastor Rebecca if you have questions or want to find out more about receiving care or joining a team to help provide care. Here are a few of the care opportunities at MVPC:

The Prayer Email

Coordinated by Pastor Rebecca, can help get prayer requests out to folks in the congregation who have committed to praying for the prayer request emails. Please let Pastor Rebecca know if you have a prayer request or if you would like to receive the prayer request emails.

Care Team Deacons & Commissioned Deacons

Coordinated by the Deacon Board, can provide you with an assigned Deacon or Commissioned Care Team Deacon to journey with you during a challenging time of life. Please let Pastor Rebecca know if you are in need of a Care Team Deacon or Commissioned Deacon or if you might be interested in joining the Commissioned Deacon Care Team to check in, visit, and journey with one or more people in need of care (interview and quarterly training provided).

The Meal Train

Coordinated by Tracy Hall, can help provide you and your family meals when you bring home a new baby, after surgery, or when you are in need of help with meals. Please let Tracy Hall know if you are in need of a Meal Train or if you would like to be a part of the team receiving Meal Train requests to provide meals.

Caregiver Assistance

Coordinated by Becky Goodell, can provide an hour or two of simple care assistance for those who are providing care for an adult family member and need an hour or two off. Please let Becky Goodell know if you are in need of caregiver assistance or if you would like to volunteer to help provide caregiver assistance (interview and training provided).

Hospital & Recovery Care Home Visitation

Can help coordinate folks to visit you while you are in the hospital or in a recovery care home if you are wanting more visitors, although we are still looking for a Coordinator and more folks to add to the team who might be able and willing to help bring a bit of joy by visiting those in the hospital and recovery care homes. Please talk with Pastor Rebecca if you are in need of visits or if you might be interested in joining the team (interview and training provided).

Transportation Assistance

Can help you find out about the Dial A Ride or help coordinate a ride for you to and from worship and church programs, although we are still looking for a Coordinator and more folks to add to the team who might be able and willing to help provide a ride (interview and training provided). Please talk with Pastor Rebecca if you are interested in joining the team or would like to find out more.

Do you have an idea for a care team role?

There are folks on the Commissioned Deacon Care Team like Sumiko Reamer who helps provide flowers for people in the hospital, Mim Ambrose who writes birthday and special occasion cards from the church (aren't they wonderful), Becky Goodell who coordinates the Welcome Team to welcome people when they first begin to visit MVPC, Ward Ernst who prepares communion and extended communion for folks, Patti Allen who helps coordinate weddings and memorials, and Bev Helton who coordinates the amazing greeters for Sunday mornings and special services. Please let Pastor Rebecca know if you have an additional idea or would like to fill a Commissioned Deacon Care Team role!

Prayer Group

Do you long for a deeper life of prayer? Prayer Group meets on Thursdays from 9 to 10 am in the church library and would love to welcome you whenever you are able to make it. We spend time checking in on how we are doing and then do a guided prayer practice like Lectio Divina, the Awareness Examen, Centering Prayer, the Welcome Prayer, and more, before spending some time in intercessory prayer for family, friends, the congregation, the community, and the world. We will not be meeting on November 28th (Thanksgiving) or December 26th (the day after Christmas). In January, during Prayer Group, we will be doing a ten week exploration of Spiritual Practices through a book study of "Joy Together" by Lynne Baab that will introduce us to a variety of spiritual practices for the new year including Thankfulness, Fasting, Contemplative Prayer, Lectio Divina. Hospitality, and Sabbath Keeping. Books will be available in the church office in mid-December for a suggested donation of \$16 to help cover costs.



Senior Bible Study

Come join us on Wednesday's at 1:00 PM for Senior Bible Study in the Fireside Room. We will be using the book, "40 Treasured Bible Verses," by James Howell. This book comes with a short commentary for each verse, but our reflections will be a chance to get to know each other and the bible. A church Women's Fellowship group is a group of women who come together to grow in their faith, connect with others and serve their church and community. Women's fellowships often include activities like Bible study, Workshops and Speaking events and can also provide opportunities to reach out to each other. When I volunteered to lead this fellowship group, I had been thinking about ways our women could get to know each other better. Our planning team came up with the idea to do a series of interviews to do just that. We have enjoyed some very interesting personal stories in the past year and are looking forward to continuing this project. We also held a lovely luncheon with a speaker at another meeting. We are open to new possibilities and encourage you to please share your ideas with us.

Our Women's Fellowship group invites any woman who wishes to join and we encourage attendees to bring friends and neighbors. It has been said that the four pillars of a successful women's ministry are study, service, support and social. We are not specifically a Bible study group, but we do bring and discuss Scripture and offer Devotions, as well as sharing our joys and concerns. The characteristics of a Biblical fellowship are many and include the following: Confidentiality - we do not gossip! We share our true feelings and encourage, support and forgive each other. We speak the truth in love, admit our weaknesses and respect our differences. Our goal is to offer a safe and comforting environment to all of our women.

We meet on the Fourth Saturday at 9:00 to 10:30 a.m., September through May, in the Fireside Room at the church. A light breakfast and beverages are available. This meeting coincides with the Men's Breakfast meetings which are held in in Good Shepherd Hall.

We encourage our members to invite friends and neighbors to join us for great food, fellowship and information. We typically have 14-18 attendees that include 4-6 of our invited community friends.
